There have been many from the first century until now, who have doubted whether or not Christ will ever return. Knowing that, let's look into the all inspired word of God, and let's examine the very important question referring to the return of Christ. Beginning with...

Christ Said He Would Return.

Jesus, in giving words of comfort to His disciples said, *"In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also"* (John 14:2-3). Here, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ confirms that He will come again.

The Apostles Were Told That Christ Would Return.

Luke, recorded concerning the ascension of Christ into heaven, *"And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, who also said, Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven"* (Acts 1:10-11). While the apostles were watching Christ ascend into heaven, they were reassured that He would also return in like manner.

The Apostle Paul Said Christ Would Return.

Paul, in his first epistle to the Thessalonian brethren wrote, *"For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep"* (1 Thessalonians 4:15). The Inspired Hebrews Writer Said Christ Would Return.

In writing about the great sacrifice of Christ, the inspired Hebrews writer penned, *"...so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation"* (Hebrews 9:28). Here, we have another example of an inspired writer acknowledging the fact that Christ will someday return.

The Apostle Peter Said Christ Would Return.

The apostle Peter declared, *"The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night..."* (2 Peter 3:9-10). You see, Peter guided by the Holy Spirit also said, the Lord is coming, but when, no one knows!
